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2022 Another Successful Year for GAHE

2022 was packed with activities for members as GAHE offered numerous educational and networking events and new programs, including our new Toastmasters club. At our Annual Meeting in November, GAHE President John Kueven, FACHE, highlighted our key accomplishments for the year. Below is a brief summary of our 2022 achievements:

- 234 new members (1,531 on roster)
- 16 members advanced to Fellow (13 previous year)
- 76 recertified Fellows (83 previous year)
- 8 in-person face-to-face (F2F) programs, 2 virtual F2F programs, and 3 F2F programs offered through community partners for a total of 19.5 F2F hours
- 19 webinars and Clubhouse programs and 1 in-person leadership program offering a total of 20 qualified hours
- Virtual Board of Governor's exam review course offering 18 qualified hours over 5 weeks
- 4 Community Partner Events with Georgia HIMSS, Health Connect South, UAB National Symposium, and Georgia HFMA Fall Institute offering a total of 34 qualified hours.
- 4 networking events, including a new joint event with Women in Healthcare at Truist Park
- Hosted our second GAHE Week in March
- The new Scholarship Subcommittee awarded 2 \$1,500 Congress scholarships and 3 \$2,500 academic scholarships
- Our mentorship program paired 84 GAHE members as mentors or mentees
- Virtual GAHE Toastmasters Club established with 24 members
- Continued financial stability


