Jyoti Sharma, M.D., graduated summa cum laude from Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia, where she earned her undergraduate degree in Women's Studies. She continued her education at Emory University School of Medicine and graduated with her medical degree in 2006. She completed her internal medicine residency at Beth Israel Medical Center in New York, New York, where she served as Chief Medical Resident from 2009-2010. Prior to joining Piedmont Heart, Dr. Sharma completed her fellowship in cardiovascular diseases at the University of Texas Health Science Center, including specialized training at MD Anderson Cancer Center, in Houston, Texas.

She received several accolades throughout her training, including a national award for excellence from the American Heart Association's clinical council on Women in Cardiology. In 2017 she was selected as one of the Atlanta Business Chronicle's 40 under Forty recipients for her work with Piedmont Healthcare's Women's Heart Program and she was awarded the William C. Waters Award for Clinical Excellence at Piedmont Atlanta Hospital in 2019.

Since joining Piedmont Heart Institute Dr. Sharma served as the Medical Director of Advance Practice Providers from 2018-2020 and oversaw the work of nearly 200 advanced practice providers across an 11 hospital system. She has been the Director of the Women's Heart Program for the healthcare system since 2017 and is currently the Medical Director of Piedmont Atlanta Hospital where she leads the strategic and operational work of physicians across multiple subspecialties.

Dr. Sharma is board certified in cardiology, echocardiography, nuclear cardiology and vascular interpretation. She is a fellow of the American College of Cardiology and the American Society of Echocardiography. She serves on both the national Cardiovascular Disease in Women Committee and national Women in Cardiology Leadership Council for the American College of Cardiology.
